

Through the Fire, Through the Years

“Through the Fire, Through the Years” looks back at Methuen Fire Department history with a memory from 29 years ago.

Figure skater Nancy Kerrigan is attacked in Detroit after a skating practice. Four men, including the ex-husband of rival Tonya Harding, are later imprisoned for the assault. South Africa holds its first multi-racial elections after the end of apartheid. Brazil wins the World Cup on United States soil. Major League Baseball players begin a 232 day strike that eventually cancels the season.

In the aftermath of the murders of Nicole Brown Simpson and Ronald Goldman, O.J. Simpson flees police in a white Ford Bronco. He is eventually arrested for the crimes, and the Dallas Cowboys defeat the Buffalo Bills 30-13 winning their second straight Super Bowl.



Through the Fire, Through the Years goes back to 1994 and the Methuen Firefighters Memorial Monument Unveiling Ceremony.

According to the book “A History of Methuen and its Fire Department” by Retired Methuen Firefighter Kenneth H. Doherty, the unveiling ceremony was literally years in the making. 1996 would mark the 150th Anniversary of the Methuen Fire Department. In 1990, an Anniversary Committee was formed. This committee would undertake several responsibilities, one of which was planning a fitting monument to our deceased firefighters.

The monument bell had been removed from the station’s hose tower, and the total cost of the monument project was estimated at \$30,000. Local businesses and individuals contributed to the cause, and the black granite base was ordered. Helfrich Brothers Boiler Works in Lawrence created the cradle to support the bell atop the base. On June 8, 1994, a large throng descended upon the Central Fire Station for the unveiling ceremony. Jubilant applause ensued upon the unveiling, and the surviving families of several Methuen firefighters tolled the bell in remembrance. Today, the monument remains the crowning centerpiece of many annual Methuen Fire Department events.

Change Your Smoke/CO Detector Batteries



Do not forget to change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors. Smoke alarms should be replaced after 10 years, and CO alarms should be replaced after 5-7 years. If you have any questions about your smoke and CO alarms, please contact the Methuen Fire Department at 978-983-8940.




